
## Design and layout for new City Hall and public library



Scottsdale City Council has accepted in principle designs for the first two Civic Center structures and a developmentallandscaping plan. They were prepared by Architect Bennie M. Gonzales following weeks of discussion with city staff, councilmen and citizen groups. Working drawings are now being prepared and should be ready for final Council approval within a month. The next step is a call for bids. Bid opening is expected by mid-November and construction is slated before January.

On the left are the design of the City Hall and layout for the first floor, where most of the public business will be done. On the right are shown the library design and first floor arrangements. The patios will add substantially to usable space without adding substantially to the cost.


## Step captains tour

The mayor and City Council have given STEP Committee captains a personal progress report on improvements and other developments of the City. The report was in the form of a tour of City projects now under way, and of sites slated for work in the year ahead.

Places of special interest visited on the tour included the new and still un-named 55 acre park adjacent to Coronado High School; the heavy equipment maintenance center, often called a corporation yard, on the southern border of the City in Tempe; Scottsdale Municipal Airport; the Civic Center site; and the site of a bridge which will be built over the Arizona Canal on Pima Road.

The bridge, incidentally, will open Pima Road from McDowell to Shea Boulevard, and is the next step in improving Pima toward its ultimate development as a divided six-lane highway.

Following the tour report, the mayor and Council hosted the 15 captains at a barbecue in City Park.
